

## GOD'S GREAT MASTER PIECE

As I search for themes for our monthly newsletter, I sometimes review old articles for inspiration. I wrote this article back in February of 2015 and it spoke to me. I hope it speaks to you again:

As Presbyterians, order plays an important part in our understanding of God and Christianity. We believe that God has ordered all life, but as humans we have messed things up pretty badly. It is only through our response to the grace of God through Jesus Christ that we can begin to reorder our lives back according to God's will.

This concept has meant a lot to me in my life and faith. I am not always an orderly person but I aspire to be and the more that I accept God's grace, the more at peace I am. I often find myself to be an impatient person. I want to see results and change quickly. However, I must remind myself that my timing is not God's timing. It is only when I accept this that I am better able to understand my place in God's plan.

In understanding God's ordering, we must accept that God is in control and we are not. We can only respond to that which God has ordained. Either we can heed and try to follow God's will or we can pout and thrash around trying to fight against it. The more that we fight God's will, the more frustrated and weaker we ultimately become. To us as Presbyterians, ordering ourselves to the will of God brings wisdom, strength, knowledge, and peace.

And underneath all order is the grace of God. God's grace and mercy is interwoven into the fabric of the universe. Each of us is a wonderful and unique thread sewn into the magnificent tapestry of creation. We are woven individually by God and are a production of his handiwork. Unfortunately, from our perspective, we do not often see in ourselves what God sees. God knows our good and bad and places us where we are meant to be. We too often see the world from our human

vantage point and do not understand our importance within the big picture.

However, that is where the good news of Jesus Christ helps us. In Christ, we are able to better see the full picture of God. We are able to see the fullness of God's plan and our rightful place within the world and universe. Once we witness this picture, we are better able to act according to our placement.

When we step back from our little world and take a look at creation, we see the picture God has set before us. We see the loving face of God staring back at us. Like the great Renaissance paintings of old, displayed before us is an image of Jesus on the cross suffering on our behalf and the glory of Jesus rising from the dead. Through this image of Christ, we begin to understand how God is reconciling all of creation towards this final theme.

As you go through your daily life, I hope that you can appreciate how important you are within the tapestry of creation. Without you, a piece of God's great masterpiece would be missing. You are precisely placed within the ordering of God. In accepting our rightful place, we accept the grace and love of God and we are a part of something much greater than ourselves.
